

# TROOP 58 SCOUT BASE CAMP PACKING LISTS

**Base camping** – these would be events where gear will not have to be carried over half a mile. During this type of camping the troop does not require you to go light, but you don't want to be wasteful with space and weight (a scout is thrifty). For this type of campout the following is recommended:
